Rashi Anand, founder of the non-governmental organization Lakshiam, which works for the homeless children, which President Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi honored during the third World Youth Forum, expressed her great happiness for honoring her presence in Egypt, especially the city of Peace, Sharm El Sheikh, South Sinai Governorate.

Anand said in exclusive statements to "Al-Dustour": "We are working to improve the situation of street children in the Indian capital, " New Delhi ", and provide essentials of education and crafts for them. The organization also organizes workshops with street children under bridges, in the red light areas and in Railway stations to educate them against drug addiction and smoking harms, within a year and a half we have spread in 6 Indian states. "

She hoped that the work in the organization would continue in all European and Arab countries, and that the energies of children would be used for good rather than evil, stressing that there are some young people who will pass on this experience to their country.

In the same context, Ahmed Hisham Radwan, owner of the first-place Agora application in the digital

"More than 90,000 pads were sold in more than one governorate, and it is scheduled to spread in more than one village inside Egypt, and the Ministry of Health gave us the necessary permits after doing all the required tests," team official Fatima Serry said in exclusive statements to Al-Dustour.

And on the benefit of the project, she stressed that this will affect this on personal and public health and hygiene and create job opportunities for women in poor villages. The project also helps to provide millions for e-waste recycling factories.

The youth expressed their great happiness for their presence and presence in the World Youth Forum in its third edition, and President Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi honored them, saying: "The honor was a surprise from the president and we are proud of our country."
