Established in 2004, Lakshyam is a NGO that uplifts children and women of at-risk communities through education & employment. Currently functional in 11 states of India with 13 centers, Lakshyam's 'Butterfly: Child Welfare & Education' program offers holistic education to children, 'Lakshyam Toy Library' is a need-based approach and 'Rooh: Awakening Women's Soul' is designed to empower women via awareness, initiation and action.

To elevate and elongate the life quality of the compromised communities in India, Lakshyam has been engaged in a number of social welfare activities like child welfare, health, education and women empowerment that are designed to set up a sustainable support system for the not-so-privileged. Lakshyam has rigorously aimed at implementing effective and innovative solutions to improve the living conditions of the suppressed and deprived communities, whose basic human rights have been denied.

Lakshyam Toy Library

Since the inception of Lakshyam Toy Library, the focus of the program has been entirely on bringing back the essence of childhood in the lives innumerable children from financially compromised backgrounds living all over the country. The existence of toys like miniature cars, bikes, board games and soft toys is oblivious to most of them so to introduce this integral experience of childhood days, Lakshyam decided to reduce the so-called difference between the privileged children and the not-so-privileged ones by connecting the two in the best possible manner.



The program involves the placement of Toy Boxes in several private schools where each student donates at least one toy or book for the cause. With an overwhelming response over the years, Lakshyam has collected more than 2,50,000 toys and books. Initially, some of these were distributed among street children, rag pickers and other impoverished children, and are now delivered at 13 Lakshyam Toy Library centers across 11 states of India. Lakshyam also supports and assists other NGOs to set up and run similar centers at their respective premises, and take the initiative forward.

Playing is an activity that is extremely vital for every child, for character building and to hone their personalities. Therefore, under this program, Lakshyam is committed towards providing entertaining/educational toys and books along with a safe, child-centric play setting at Lakshyam's centers for the tiny tots to feel safe, cherished and loved.

Initiatives:



Lakshyam opened two new Toy Libraries in Madhya Pradesh. One Center is in Ujjain and another in Bhopal, in association with the Anganwadis in the area.

Lakshyam also expanded its reach to Leh, Jammu & Kashmir and undertook two government run Centers, Bal Ashram & Nari Niketan, where young boys and girls respectively, aged 5-15 years took refuge. The beneficiaries have either been abandoned or orphaned due to the cloudburst in 2010 that led to the unfortunate Ladakh floods.



The fourth Toy Library was initiated in Rajasthan. The NGO, MaitriMannthan, is based in Udaipur and is working on different segments for social awareness & development. Besides initiating and implementing a Remedial Education Center in a slum area, the NGO also works with Gram Panchayats.

Butterfly: Child Welfare and Education

Butterfly: Child Welfare and Education' program was established to cater to the impoverished children who require comprehensive assistance, in order to broaden their horizons through opportunities.

Since the inception of Butterfly, the focus of the program has been to integrate the two pivotal building blocks of a healthy child, Development & Participation. With that intention, almost 300 children at Lakshyam's Remedial Education Centre in JJ Basti, Vasant Kunj, New Delhi are extended learning encompassing textual and practical knowledge, while paying special attention to lessons on personality development. Besides imparting education covering Hindi, English and Computers, integral components like cleanliness, hygiene, discipline and positive life habits are stressed upon to help the impressionable minds join the mainstream society with a strengthened capability and in a more confident capacity.



Several supportive volunteers from all walks of life are involved in the program and support the teachers at the Centre to provide an environment that optimally helps each child attain their educational potential and regenerate their lost interest in studies. Monthly activities like dance, drawing and painting classes, games, puppet shows and magic shows keep the children enthusiastic and fun spirited. The workshops and programs provide an all-round basic education, to enable the not-so-privileged, slum children to join the societal mainstream.

Along with the classroom activities, the program regularly conducts parent-teacher meetings and makes home visits to strengthen its contact with the community. Butterfly maintains regular contact with the local community leaders as well, to prosper in a healthy environment.

Delhi West Round Table 50 graciously extended financial support to one of Lakshyam's special children who suffers from a genetic skin disorder and needed immediate attention. We are thankful for their generosity!



Lakshyam celebrated Christmas at its Center with the underprivileged kids and Santa Claus distributed gifts.

To celebrate Citi Global Community Day on the 30th of June, the Delhi team from the prestigious Bank visited Lakshyam's School where some exciting activities such as cleanliness drive, painting & storytelling session were organized. 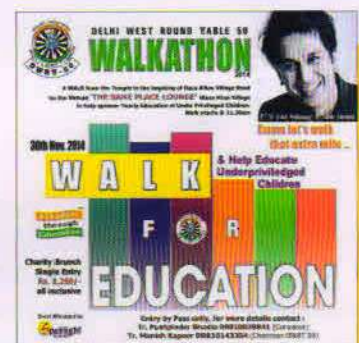

In collaboration with SLAP - Street Level Awareness Program, a workshop on 'Women Safety & Street Survival' workshop was carried out. The grueling session included self defence basics and street survival techniques training for all by some of the international boxing champions and trainers.

Rooh



To think of living with almost no control and freedom over one's own life is quite suffocating and constantly hinders one's personal growth. This might come across as an exaggerated and frivolous thinking to many, but such is the story of innumerable women across the globe. When it comes to their basic education, health, security or even living conditions, women have been suppressed and their dreams and aspirations squashed.

Lakshyam's project, Rooh, was designed and initiated to focus on creating an environment conducive for women from the not-so-privileged communities, in order to provide necessary opportunities for skill building and empowerment.

Since the inception of Rooh, the focus of the program has been to create awareness in the society on issues affecting the lives of women, like the education on health & hygiene and recognition of basic civic sense. Lakshyam strives to provide training to community women in child care; facilitate them in opening neighbourhood crèches to have a better understanding of infant care. Integrated focus on teaching the art of sewing, cutting, stitching and embroidery to women, thus creating opportunities for income enhancement has also been one of the focus areas. The program works for empowering women of all age groups, by providing basic resources and strengthening their skills to help them maintain a healthy lifestyle, and regain stability and positivity.

To break the taboo among women of compromised communities regarding Sanitary Napkins, the teachers and trainers of Lakshyam attended an insightful training on 'Sanitary Napkins: Need and Urgency to Break the Taboo with Practical Solutions' by NJPC, one of the main initiatives of Goonj. The training was based on clean, safe and quick methods to make sanitary napkins that can be sold by the women of the Self Help Groups of Lakshyam in Ranchi, Jharhand.



Post the workshop, the trainers of Lakshyam carried out a training session for the women at Lakshyam's Delhi Center.

At the reputed fashion exhibition of 'Medusa by Sonal Jindal', Lakshyam's handcrafted products received a thunderous response at The Grand, New Delhi.





Women undergoing extensive training under Lakshyam's women empowerment program, 'Rooh: Awakening Women's Soul', exhibited Papad packets for the first time ever in Ranchi. The appreciation received was indeed motivational.

Lakshyam initiated collaboration with Enactus SRCC. The trainers of Lakshyam carried out a Sanitary Napkin training session in Nekpur Village near Ghaziabad.

New Projects:
To celebrate Women's Day in a more elaborate manner, Lakshyam, in collaboration with Enactus Ramjas initiated a long-term project of skill training of Handmade Tote Bags. The women empowerment project aims at including the creative, colorful and crafty products in the Lakshyam Product Line. Lakshyam also initiated a new collaborative project with Enactus Miranda House - Project Sakshakt. The project includes production and sale of Dustless Chalks to introduce sustainable entrepreneurship to the women at Lakshyam.

Lakshyam organized a Dental camp in collaboration with Clove Dental.

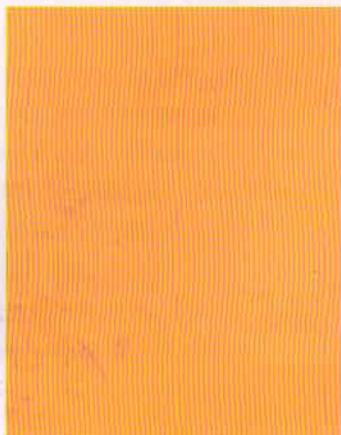

The Camp aimed at identifying and eliminating Breast, Cervical and Oral cancer in an institutionalized and structured manner by creating awareness amongst women of the nuances of this dreadful disease and its early detection through screening processes and self examinations.

Initiatives of IIT Delhi
