Lakshyam was founded in the year 2004, by a group of people who shared a common dream, goal and had come together to contribute towards society & people development with focus in the area of child education, development and women empowerment.

Inspired by Gandhian ideals of social change, what guides us is the talisman – “Whenever you are in doubt, or when the self becomes too much with you, apply the following test. Recall the face of the poorest and the weakest man (woman) whom you may have seen, and ask yourself, if the step you contemplate is going to be any use to him (her). Will he (she) gain anything by it? Will it restore him (her) to a control over his (her) own life and destiny? In other words, will it lead to Swaraj (freedom) for the hungry and starving millions? Then you will find your doubts and yourself melt away.”

This year witnessed significant expansion and strengthening of our initiatives and programs. The initiative Saksham – Child welfare and development witnessed enrolment of over 200 children in our centre since its launch in April 2012. Lakshyam Toy Library established its presence in 3 more states this year and over 70,000 toys were distributed across the country.

The initiative Prayas – Toward women's awakening witnessed various programs on women's vocational training and skill building. Launch of DELHI PRIMES -2012: Women in Power, a coffee table book profiling eminent women of Delhi who have excelled in various fields, came together to support Lakshyam.

We thank all our donors, partners, working teams and employees who have enabled Lakshyam to exist, work and contribute towards society and nation building. I invite suggestions and critique for our work so as to further strengthen our organisation.

In line with our mission, we conduct regular studies in the area of our work. Based on our findings we develop and design programs to meet the needs of our targeted beneficiaries and aim to execute them with excellence. Aiming towards child development, education and women entrepreneurship, Lakshyam currently manages three programs:

OUR PROGRAMS

Lakshyam Toy Library

"Some own hundreds, many none, but every child covets them." Play has long been acknowledged as a crucial factor in children's development, linked to intellectual, motor and personal and social development. Play is related to the development of creativity, healthy brain development, self-confidence, resilience and health and fitness. Poverty creates an obvious inequality for children in access to books, play equipment and materials.

Lakshyam has tied up with NGOs across various states in the country and set up libraries of used toys so that poor kids, who cannot afford these playthings, are not deprived of the pleasure of growing up. Play is valued as an essential part of the lives of children and toy libraries are an integral part of all our communities. These libraries provide children with development tools for play and are an important community and social resource.

Lakshyam has installed toy boxes in several schools and inspire students to donate toys or books for the cause. In the year 2012 we managed to collect over 70,000 toys and books. We are committed to provide entertaining/educational toys and books with safe, child centered and special play setting across all our centers. We are also supporting and assisting other NGOs to set up and run such centers at their premises.



We are grateful to SAFEXPRESS logistics who have partnered with Lakshyam's Toy Library Program. They provide transport facility required to set up Lakshyam Toy Libraries across the country.

During this year Lakshyam has set up 3 Toy Libraries, in **Kerala**, **Jharkhand** and **Tamil Nadu**.

OUR PROGRAMS

Saksham Child Welfare & Education

India is home to over 300 million children of the world. This constitutes the largest number of children in the world. Most if not all of these children have never attended school. It is because of lack of education that these children are unable to come out of this vicious cycle of child trafficking, labor and related issues.

This enhances the need for education as an essential step towards empowerment. Education is a developmental need that is often side lined, especially for the marginalized people. It is children from these backgrounds who are usually enrolled in government or municipal schools. A majority of our children in rural and even urban areas are left with no option but to attend poor quality and often dysfunctional schools.

Over the years, the need for private tuition for children has been seen as a necessity for all the school going children. Keeping in mind all these needs, Lakshyam has setup Remedial Education Centres with the following objectives:

- To provide supportive education through remedial classes.
- To integrate the drop out children into mainstream schooling.
- To regenerate the lost interest of these children in studies.
- To help each child attain his/her full educational potential

The program Prayaas aims to empower the women and girls of India, guarantee their fundamental rights, and increase understanding of social issues from a gender perspective. Through this program we strive to educate and empower women with the skills and confidence necessary to earn a living, maintain a healthy lifestyle, and regain a home for themselves and their children.



A step towards economic empowerment through vocational guidance and trainings...

The vocational education and training program at Lakshyam envisages a scenario where the people residing in the slum clusters are being provided with an opportunity to discover their own knack and aptitude for a particular vocation and enhance their skills for the same.

Health Program

Workshops on Health and Nutrition Awareness

Malnutrition remains a serious problem in India and many developing countries. Globally, nearly 1 billion people still go hungry. Nearly one in four children under age of five is underweight. Workshop on health and nutrition was organised across centres for women and children. Good hygiene habits, nutrition habits were shared and demonstrated through stories and charts.



Breastfeeding awareness session

A breastfeeding awareness session was conducted for the community women. The WHO and UNICEF recommendations for optimal infant and young child feeding were highlighted:


- Early initiation of breastfeeding with one hour of birth
- Exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of life
- The introduction of nutritionally adequate and safe complementary foods at six months together with continued breastfeeding up to two years and beyond



Micronutrient – Iodine deficiency awareness session

An awareness session on iodine deficiency was conducted for the community women. As part of the workshop, demonstration on how salt can be tested for iodine content at household level was done.

Though micronutrients are required in very small amounts, the consequences of their absence are severe. Iodine, vitamin A and iron are the most important in global public health terms, their lack represents a major threat to the health and development of populations the world over, particularly women and children.



Eye Camp

Lakshyam, as part of its healthcare drive, organized an eye check-up camp at Delhi in collaboration with Sant Parmanand Hospital.

In this drive, patients suffering from eye problems were examined. Apart from examination, free medicines were also distributed and free cataract operations were conducted on 9 people to restore their eyesight.
